

Base Commander Huey Dietrich: Let us at this time, with a moment of silent prayer, remember our Shipmates who made the supreme sacrifice that we may gather here in Peace. Commander Peter Hoegel Jr. - Executive officer of the Pittsburgh Navy Requiting District was the guest speaker who presented awards to each of the WWII veterans who were the guests of honor. In addition to the awards, we were asked to present Quilts of Valor to the WWII Submarine Veterans. Charles Schwertfeger - Wheeling, WV received the Group Star Quilt that we made at a workshop. We also presented a QOV to Base Commander, Huey Dietrich -Glenshaw -Vietnam. His QOV was made by Ruthann Sesti. Each of the veterans were touched by the gesture and we received many, many compliments about the beauty and workmanship of our quilts.

We are ready for the US Army Reserve's Yellow Ribbon Celebration that will be scheduled within the next 60 - 90 days. The celebration will NOT be held at the Washington Armory but at an offsite non-military location. As soon as I get the final details, I will pass them along to you. I have received two requests from the QOVF for local veterans. One veteran from Portersville, Leroy Leise, served in the US Army during the Korean War. His wife of 56 years passed 18 months ago. The second veteran lives in Gibsonia and served 12 years in the Marine Corps. Michael Ditto was deployed 7 times to Iraq and has a 100% disability rating from the VA. He was a founding member of MARSOC (Marine Corps Special Operations Command). I will be presenting a QOV to Michael at his home on December 21 after his children get home from school \odot .
